Folk-Sing & Picnic, Sunday, June 29; noon-5pm

A day of getting together and singing in this delightful setting where we held our festival two years ago. We will supply minimal organization to help things get going; you supply enthusiasm and your lunch, etc. We go rain or shine since there are several buildings which we can use if the weather doesn't cooperate. Take 287 to first Morristown exit & go into Morristown. From the center of Morristown (the Green) take route 202 north (Speedwell Ave) one mile to Historic Speedwell.

Wave Hill is unique in its setting; workshops take place in areas around the grounds overlooking the Hudson River, and the concert will take place in a new location under the magnificent shade trees. (We promise a change from the unrelenting sun of last year!) Wave Hill is a perfect setting on a nice day but if it rains we still have excellent indoor facilities including the vaulted ceiling baronial hall which can seat 200 (constructed by one of the former owners of the estate). Folk Festival Day Performers:

The Albion Tour Band is led by noted vocalist *Cathy LeSurf* with *Phil Beer* on guitar, mandolin, fiddle, & vocals; *Martin Bell* on fiddle & synthesizer; and *Mark Steed* on keyboards. This English band is known world-wide for their tasteful interpretation of English traditional music on a combination of traditional and electric instruments. Their workshop will be a presentation of early English song and dance including 16th Century Brales.

Antara is the name of a pre-colombian panpipe which has been taken by this New York based group: *Tato Dalera* was born in Tandil, Argentina; *Leider Dorado* was born in Popayan, Columbia; and *Jalil Kifafi* was born in Lilloe, Chile. The group gives a lively presentation of folk songs and tunes from Latin America. To compliment their vocal harmonies they play woodwinds (antrara, kena, kenancho, zampona, tarkas, moncenos, & pinkillos), strings (guitar, cuatro, charango, tiple, & Paraguayan harp), and percussion (bombo leguero, chaches, maraches, claves, timbadoras, cajon peruano, & pandero). In addition to their appearance in the concert they will do a workshop in Andian music.

John Roberts & Lisa Preston perform the traditional songs of Britain & Ireland ranging from classic ballads to drinking songs. Both are accomplished singers and musicians: Lisa plays clavinet, Irish harp & guitar; John plays both English & Anglo concertinas, guitar & banjo.

Bobbie Wayne, a member of NYPFMC, lives in Peekskill, NY and plays the Celtic Harp. She will give a workshop on a sampling of Celtic music on the harp.

Anne Price is a member of NYPFMC and is well known to many of us for her lovely interpretations of traditional & contemporary folk songs. Her children's program includes lots of sing-alongs on lots of instruments.

Other Workshop Performers can't be mentioned individually because of space limitations. Bring a sacred harp book and be sure to bring your voice &/or instrument and share your music on the Open Stage.

BOATING/PICNICKING/SINGING; Sat Aug 16, 1PM till ?

"Sail and Sing" with Woody Kozin, who invites you to spend an enjoyable August afternoon on the banks of the Hudson River, cooled by pleasant river breezes and the sheltering shade of the towering Palisades. The main event, boat rides, seven people at a time, aboard Woody's 22-footer, the "Big Annie." Other attractions; good picnic facilities (bring food), two hiking trails, wading beach, historical house and tavern, cliff-side pavilion, modern bathrooms, and lots of boats and scenery to look at. Location: The Alpine boat basin, about 7 miles north of the G.W. Bridge. By car; Palisades Parkway north from the bridge, to exit 2, the Alpine exit. (Don't take exit 1, for the Englewood boat basin). From exit 2, go down the hill to a traffic circle; go left around circle and continue down the hill toward the boat basin. Pay toll (\$2 per car) and park. Meet the gang at the pavilion around 1:30PM, or at any time at Woody's boat -- first gate, to dock 40. By bus, from the G.W. Bridge bus terminal, get bus that goes north on 9W, and ask driver to let you off at the road going down to the boat basin; the Palisades Pkwy police HQ is close to this point. Go down hill, past police HQ, about 1/2 mile. DRIVERS: offer rides to those without wheels, to be helpful and to share the tolls. For info, call Woody at 201/440-5465. Also, you can call him to offer rides or to find out who is offering them.

Jobs marked (WW) are done on Winter Weekends as well as Spring and Fall; all others are done on Spring and Fall Weekends only.

WEEKEND CHAIR: Full scholarship. A management job with responsibility for the performance of all the other jobs. Keeps records and is the club's contact with the manager of the facility we are using.

ASSISTANT WEEKEND CHAIR: Half scholarship. Works mostly at the weekend, helping as needed. Arranges chairs for concerts, checks supplies, runs errands.

TYPIST/ROOM ASSIGNER: Half scholarship. Types and assigns rooms. It helps to know a lot of club members.

ADVANCE REGISTRAR: Full scholarship. Receives, records, and acknowledges all reservations, maintains waiting list, processes cancellations. On Winter Weekends, assigns rooms. (WW)

REGISTRAR: 2 at half scholarship each. Registers people as they arrive at camp, accepts and records payments. One registrar arrives early to put name tags on doors and set up registration table.

TRANSPORTATION: Full scholarship. Tries to find rides to and from camp for all those who need them. Gets and gives out information on public transportation if needed. (WW)

WAITERS: 4 or 5 full scholarships. (Camp Freedman only) Set tables, serve meals, clear tables.

BABYSITTER: Full scholarship. Cares for small children, usually during evening concerts. Hourly fee paid by parents.

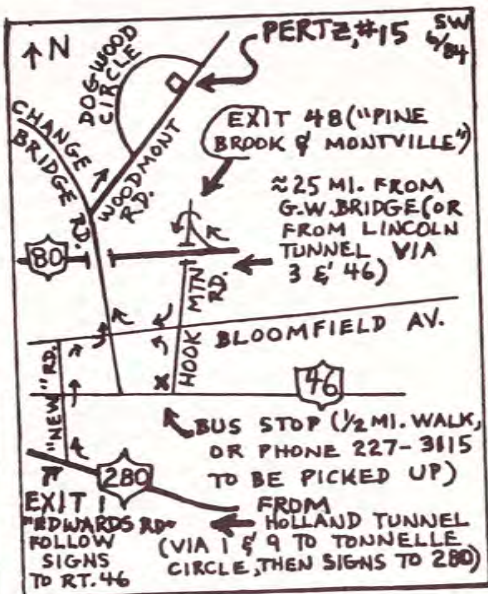

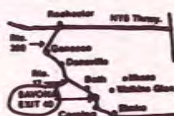
